Gender-Based Violence Workstream



Project Brief

The project will contribute to improved access to quality gender-based violence (GBV) and sexual and reproductive health services for women affected by violence, including first line support, care of injuries, urgent medical treatment and forensic examinations, without barriers and discrimination.

Project Outcomes

- Strengthened institutional capacities in the health sector to prevent and respond to GBV in selected provinces.
- Strengthened multi-sectoral coordination to prevent and respond to GBV in selected provinces.

Key Interventions

- Strengthen the health-sector response to GBV by implementing the national guidelines for the management of GBV in the health sector and capacity building of health service providers.
- Adapt the World Health Organisation (WHO) manual for healthcare managers.
- Integrate GBV in the midwife curriculum and develop a GBV toolkit for new health sector civil servants' induction.
- Support multisectoral coordination support and service mapping.
- Contribute to conduct the Cambodia Demographic and Health Survey (CDHS) 2020, particularly the domestic violence module through training, data collection and data processing.
- Advocate for budget allocation for GBV by the Ministry of Health (MoH), Provincial Health Departments (PHDs) and Provincial Departments of Women's Affairs (PDoWAs).

COVID-19 Interventions

- Internal assessment of the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on Violence Against Women (VAW) in the United Nations Population Fund's (UNFPA) target provinces.
- Collaborate with ACCESS and the Ministry of Women's Affairs (MoWA) to produce Information, Education and Communication (IEC) materials on VAW in the context of COVID-19 and deliver in four UNFPA target provinces.

Beneficiaries

- Direct: Women and girls who are potentially vulnerable to GBV, health providers, members of the provincial- and district-level GBV Working Groups.
- Indirect: Households of the four priority provinces.

Geographic Location

Kampong Cham, Tbong Khmum, Stung Treng, Preah Vihear and national level.
