

## IMPLEMENTING PARTNERS FACT SHEET

### Gender-Based Violence Workstream



#### Project Brief

The project will address the priority of enhancing access to survivor-centred legal protection and justice by emphasizing the capacity-building of government service providers and strengthened stakeholder coordination. The project focuses on enhancing the quality of existing services and ensuring sustainability through innovative approaches.

#### Project Outcomes

- District officers in two provinces are competent to provide training for mediation on gender-based violence (GBV) cases.
- The Ministry of Women’s Affairs’ (MoWA) Judicial Police Agents/Officers (JPA/JPOs) in two provinces are competent to perform their duties to assist women affected by GBV.
- Women affected by or at-risk of experiencing GBV in two provinces have greater access to legal information, mediation party assistance, and legal aid.
- GBV Working Groups are officially recognized and fully functional in four districts.

#### Key Interventions

- Provide training and coaching to MoWA’s JPA/JPOs.
- Provide legal services to GBV survivors including legal counselling and mediation party assistance.
- Provide Training of Trainers (ToTs) on mediation/alternative dispute resolution mechanisms to deputy district governors, district legislation and local dispute mediation officers and district women’s affairs officers.
- Build capacities of members of four GBV Working Groups on legal services, mediation/alternative dispute resolution mechanisms, Minimum Basic Standard Counselling (MBSC), and other packages of services.
- Develop a legal aid manual on GBV for interested parties including legal practitioners and provide information on service provision to survivors of GBV.
- Conduct a radio program talk show on legal services and GBV related laws.

#### COVID-19 Interventions

- Use radio talk show to broadcast information on COVID-19 prevention measures.

#### Beneficiaries

- Direct: Women affected by GBV who are seeking legal recourse in the two target provinces, district Justice Service Centre (JSC) officials and deputy district governors responsible for Alternative Dispute

Resolution (ADR) (where JSCs do not exist), MoWA's JPA/JPOs and District Office of Women's Affairs (DOWA) officials.

- Indirect: Interested parties including public and legal practitioners.
